

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL
HELD TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 16, 2021, 7:30 P.M.**

CONVENE: Mayor Tom Adams convened the Regular Meeting of the Monrovia City Council on Tuesday, February 16, 2021, at 7:32 p.m. in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California. In attendance were City Manager Dylan Feik, Assistant City Manager Lauren Vasquez and City Clerk Alice D. Atkins. City Attorney Craig A. Steele participated via videoconference.


