

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE  
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL  
HELD TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2015, 7:30 P.M.**

**CONVENE:** Mayor Adams convened the Regular Meeting of the Monrovia City Council of Tuesday, November 3, 2015, at 7:30 p.m. in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, preceded by a Special Meeting / MAP Leadership Academy Graduation at 6:30 p.m., at which all Councilmembers were present. In attendance were City Manager Oliver Chi, City Attorney Craig A. Steele, and City Clerk Alice D. Atkins.

**INVOCATION:** Police Chaplain Terrance Brown led the invocation.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** Mayor Pro Tem Spicer led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**PH-1 An Urgency Interim Moratorium Ordinance Of The City Of Monrovia, Enacted Pursuant To California Government Code Section 65858, Extending The Interim Moratorium Prohibiting The Demolition Of Any Main Building On A Property In The City Constructed Prior To January 1, 1940 (Ordinance Number 2014-16U) And The Interim Moratorium Prohibiting The Issuance Of Building Permits For The Construction Of New Residential Dwellings Or Specified Substantial Additions To Residential Dwellings And Accessory Structures (Ordinance Number 2014-17U), Both, For A Period Up To One (1) Year During The Pendency Of The City's Review And Potential Adoption Of Relevant Permanent Building And Zoning Regulations, Making Findings Required By Government Code Section 65858 And Declaring The Urgency Hereof, Adoption of Urgency Ordinance No. 2015-11U:**

City Attorney Steele read the title of Ordinance No. 2015-11U as follows:

**AN URGENCY INTERIM MORATORIUM ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MONROVIA, CALIFORNIA EXTENDING FOR UP TO ONE YEAR ORDINANCE NOS. 2014-14U AND 2014-14, ENACTED PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 65858 PROHIBITING THE ISSUANCE OF BUILDING PERMITS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SPECIFIED NEW RESIDENTIAL DWELLINGS OR SPECIFIED SUBSTANTIAL ADDITIONS TO RESIDENTIAL DWELLINGS AND ACCESSORY STRUCTURES DURING THE PENDENCY OF THE CITY'S REVIEW AND POTENTIAL ADOPTION OF**

**RELEVANT PERMANENT BUILDING AND ZONING REGULATIONS, AND DECLARING THE URGENCY HEREOF**
