



**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE  
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL  
HELD TUESDAY, MAY 2, 2017, 7:30 P.M.**

**STUDY SESSION:** Mayor Tom Adams convened the Study Session Meeting of the Monrovia City Council at 4:05 p.m. on Tuesday, May 2, 2017, in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all Councilmembers were present, with the exception of Mayor Pro Tem Blackburn, who was excused, to discuss Marijuana Regulation Proposals. Following review and discussion, Staff was directed to develop regulations to ban outdoor cultivation, to implement a permitting process for indoor cultivation, and to ban sales. A proposed zoning ordinance would first be considered at a Planning Commission Public Hearing before consideration by the City Council at a subsequent Public Hearing. Mayor Adams adjourned the meeting at 4:55 p.m.

**CLOSED SESSION:** Mayor Adams convened the Special Joint Closed Session Meeting of the Monrovia City Council and the Successor Agency to the Monrovia Redevelopment Agency at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 2, 2017, in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all Councilmembers were present to discuss the following Closed Session items: CS-1 Conference with Real Property Negotiator pursuant to Government Code §54956.8; Assessor Parcel Nos. 8507-003-907, 8507-003-908, 8507-003-909; Successor Agency Negotiator: Executive Director; City Negotiator: City Attorney; Negotiating Party: CFT NV Developments, LLC; Under Negotiation: Price and Terms of Payment. Mayor Adams Adjourned the meeting at 5:25 p.m.

Steele, and City Clerk Alice D. Atkins.

**INVOCATION:** Police Chaplin Terrence Brown led the invocation.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** Councilmember Larry J. Spicer led the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Clerk Alice Atkins reviewed the Agenda Report.


