

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE  
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL  
HELD TUESDAY, OCTOBER 6, 2015, 7:30 P.M.**

**CLOSED SESSION:** Mayor Tom Adams convened the Closed Session Meeting of the Monrovia City Council at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 6, 2015, in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all Councilmembers were present to discuss the following Closed Session items: CS-1 Public Employee Performance Evaluation Pursuant to Government Code §54957: City Manager, and CS-2 Public Employee Performance Evaluation pursuant to Government Code §54957: City Attorney. Mayor Adams adjourned the meeting at 7:20 p.m.

**CONVENE:** Mayor Adams convened the Regular Meeting of the Monrovia City Council of Tuesday, October 6, 2015, at 7:30 p.m. in City Council Chambers. In attendance were City Manager Oliver Chi, City Attorney Craig A. Steele, and City Clerk Alice D. Atkins.

**INVOCATION:** Chaplain Terrence Brown led the invocation.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** Councilmember Alexander C. Blackburn led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**ROLL CALL:** In attendance were Councilmembers Alexander C. Blackburn, Gloria Crudgington, Becky A. Shevlin, Mayor Pro Tem Larry J. Spicer, and Mayor Tom Adams.

**REPORT OF CLOSED SESSION:** City Attorney Craig Steele stated that the City Council met in closed session to discuss the items on the posted agenda. There was no reportable action.

**PH-1 Amendment to Subsection 17.28.135 (Electronic Message Boards) of Chapter 17.28 (Signs) of Title 17 (Zoning) of the Monrovia Municipal Code to allow Recreational Facilities in the Public/Quasi-Public Zone (P/QP) to install Electronic Message Boards; Introduction and First Reading of Ordinance No. 2015-09**

Steve Sizemore, Director of Community Development, reviewed the Agenda Report.

Mayor Adams opened and closed the public hearing, as there was no one present who wished to speak for or against the matter.

**It was moved by Councilmember Blackburn, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Spicer, to introduce, waive further reading, and read by title only Ordinance No. 2015-09. The motion carried unanimously.**

The City Attorney read the title of Ordinance No. 2015-09 as follows:

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONROVIA, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING SUBSECTION 17.28.135 (ELECTRONIC MESSAGE BOARDS) OF CHAPTER 17.28 (SIGNS) OF TITLE 17 (ZONING) OF THE MONROVIA MUNICIPAL CODE TO ALLOW RECREATIONAL FACILITIES IN THE PUBLIC/QUASI PUBLIC ZONE (P/QP) TO INSTALL ELECTRONIC MESSAGE BOARDS**

**PH-2 Proposed Adjustments for Water and Sewer Fees; Introduction and First Reading of Ordinance No. 2015-10; and Adoption of Resolution No. 2015-52**

Mayor Adams reviewed an outline describing the process of the Public Hearing, noting that although there were two proposed rate adjustments, the public hearings would be held together for efficiency.

Management Analyst Brittany Mello, Director of Public Services Tina Cherry, and City Manager Oliver Chi reviewed the Agenda Report. Ms. Mello responded to questions regarding unanticipated infrastructure failures and the impact on project schedule, whether costs would rise if projects were delayed.

At the request of Mayor Adams, City Clerk Atkins stated that the number of people eligible to file protests related to water rates was 9,103, a majority would equal 4,552 protests, and the current count at the beginning of the meeting was 455 protests, or 5% of eligible accounts; the number of people eligible to file protests related to sewer rates was 8,559, a majority would equal 4,280 protests, and the current count at the beginning of the meeting was 371 protests, or 4.3% of eligible accounts.

Mayor Adams opened the Public Hearing.

Mayor Adams closed the Public Hearing, called for members of the audience to submit any remaining protest ballots to the City Clerk, and called for a short recess at 10:02 p.m. to allow for the final tabulation of protest votes.

Mayor Adams reconvened the meeting at 10:08 p.m. City Clerk Atkins reported the total protest ballots cast for the proposed water rate adjustment as 463; the total protest ballots cast for proposed sewer rate adjustment as 378.

Following brief discussion, **it was moved by Councilmember Shevlin, seconded by Councilmember Crudgington, to introduce, waive further reading, and read by title only Ordinance No. 2015-10.** The motion carried by unanimous vote.

City Attorney Steele read the title of Ordinance 2015-10 as follows:

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONROVIA, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING A SCHEDULE OF WATER SERVICE CHARGES AND WASTEWATER (SEWER) SERVICE CHARGES**

**It was moved by Councilmember Shevlin, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Spicer, to adopt Resolution No. 2015-52.** The motion carried unanimously.
