

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL
HELD TUESDAY, JULY 7, 2015, 7:30 P.M.**

STUDY SESSION: Tom Adams convened the Study Session of the Monrovia City Council at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, July 7, 2015, in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all Councilmembers were present to discuss Fiscal Year 2015-2017 Base Capital Improvement Program Budget Review. Mayor Adams adjourned the meeting at 6:43 p.m.




