STUDY SESSION: Mayor Tom Adams convened the Study Session of the Monrovia City Council of Tuesday, December 4, 2018, at 5:03 p.m. in City Council Chambers, 415 S. Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all members were present, to discuss GoMonrovia Update and Review of possible program modifications and Review of State and Local zoning and permitting regulations for Sidewalk Vending regulations, Micro-Enterprise regulations, Mobile Vending standards and Signage standards. Mayor Adams adjourned the meeting at 6:29 p.m.

This item was pulled from the agenda.


