

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR OF THE
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL
HELD TUESDAY, JANUARY 21, 2025, 7:30 P.M.**

AR-2 Amendment to Title 17 (Zoning Code) of the Monrovia Municipal Code, Amending Regulations Pertaining to Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) and Junior Accessory Dwelling Units (JADUs) in Compliance with California State Law; Introduction and First Reading of Ordinance No. 2025-01

Jennifer Driver, Senior Planner, reviewed the staff report and answered questions of the City Council.

Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Spicer, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Dr. Kelly, to introduce, waive further reading, read by title only Ordinance No. 2025-01 and set for Public Hearing on February 4, 2025. The motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONROVIA, CALIFORNIA AMENDING TITLE 17 (ZONING) OF THE MONROVIA MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS AND JUNIOR ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS TO COMPLY WITH RECENT CHANGES TO STATE LAW, AND FINDING THE ORDINANCE TO BE EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT

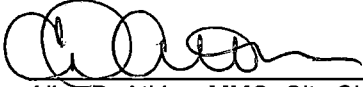

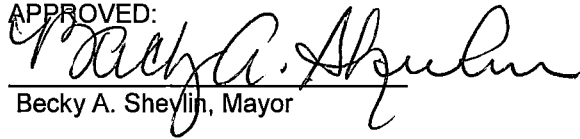
