

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL
HELD TUESDAY, MARCH 3, 2015, 7:30 P.M.**

CLOSED SESSION: Mayor Mary Ann Lutz convened the Closed Session Meeting of the Monrovia City Council at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 3, 2015, in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all Councilmembers were present to discuss the following Closed Session items: CS-1 Conference with Legal Counsel, Initiation of Litigation Pursuant to Government Code §54956.9 (c); One (1) Potential Case; CS-2 Conference with Real Property Negotiator Pursuant to Government Code §54956.8; Assessor Parcel Nos. 8503-004-900, 8503-004-901, and 8503-004-902; Agency Negotiator: Oliver Chi, City Manager; Negotiating Parties: Pokrajac Corporation; Under Negotiation: Price and Terms of Payment; CS-3 Conference with Real Property Negotiator Pursuant to Government Code §54956.8; Assessor Parcel No. 8501-012-002; Agency Negotiator: Oliver Chi, City Manager; Negotiating Parties: Tyler C. CONVENE: Mayor Lutz convened the Regular Meeting of the Monrovia City Council of Tuesday, March 3, 2015, at 7:30 p.m. in City Council Chambers. In attendance were City Manager Oliver Chi, City Attorney Craig A. Steele, and City Clerk Alice D. Atkins.

INVOCATION: Police Chaplain Terrence Brown led the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Councilmember Larry J. Spicer led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL: In attendance were Councilmembers Tom Adams, Alexander C. Blackburn, Larry J. Spicer, Mayor Pro Tem Becky A. Shevlin, and Mayor Mary Ann Lutz.

REPORT OF CLOSED SESSION: City Attorney Craig A. Steele stated that the City Council met in closed session to discuss the items on the posted agenda and there was no reportable action.

ORDER OF BUSINESS: City Manager Oliver Chi stated there were no changes to the order of business.

CONSENT CALENDAR: Mayor Lutz noted that item CC-1 had been pulled and would be postponed to the next meeting. **It was moved by Councilmember Adams, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Shevlin, to approve the remainder of the consent calendar.** The motion carried unanimously. REPORTS OF CITY MANAGE AND STAFF:

Prior to presenting the scheduled update on grant funds, City Manager Chi reviewed facts surrounding alleged improper discharge of solid waste at the City's well field, emphasizing that water from the wells was safe to drink, and reviewed next steps in terms of third party testing, remediation, on-going enhanced water quality reporting, and investigations.

RCM-1 Update on Grant Funds: In response to questions regarding loss of grant funds, City Manager Chi provided an overview of key grants, including the \$927,000 Historic Depot Rehabilitation Grant, \$1.9 million Downtown Street Scape Project Grant, \$1.8 million Huntington Drive Reconstruction Grant, as well as a recap of overall Station square Project funding. He provided explanations regarding the de-obligation of a portion of the Depot grant funds, loss of and subsequent criminal investigation related to Downtown Street Scape funds, and reallocation of the Huntington Drive reconstruction funds.

RCM-2 Report on Water Leaks: Tina Cherry, Interim Director of Public Works, provided a report on water leaks over the past three calendar years, and answered questions regarding the current Water Master Plan project. City Manager Chi indicated that staff would evaluate the current contract to determine if the project scope should be modified.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS:

AR-1 Year 2014-2015 Mid-Year Budget Update, Resolution No. 2015-03

Administrative Services Director Mark Alvarado and City Manager Chi reviewed the agenda report related to 2014-2015 Fiscal Year budget adjustments and proposed reorganization.

Discussion ensued regarding how the effectiveness of the reorganization would be evaluated and reported, reduction of salaries achieved by shifting from management staff to front-line staff, and oversight of contract engineer services.

In response to concerns raised by the speaker, City Manager Chi provided additional explanation regarding utilizing services of engineering firms with existing contracts recently approved by the City Council following a full Request for Proposals process, and continued to recommend moving forward with the proposal.

It was moved by Councilmember Adams, seconded by Councilmember Blackburn, to adopt Resolution No. 2015-03, authorize the proposed positional adjustments associated with the departmental reorganization effort, approve the contract city engineering services agreement with Merrell Johnson Engineering in a form approved by the City Attorney, and authorize the City Manager to execute the contract. The motion carried unanimously.

AR-2 Agreement with Lawrence R. Moss & Associates, Inc., for Landscape Architectural Design Services related to Huntington Drive Median Improvement Project in an Amount not to Exceed \$8,500.00

Oliver Chi, City Manager, reviewed the Agenda Report.

It was moved by Councilmember Adams, seconded by Councilmember Blackburn, to approve an agreement with Lawrence R. Moss & Associates, Inc., for Landscape Architectural Design Services related to Huntington Drive Median Improvement Project in an amount not to exceed \$8,500.00 and authorize the City Manager to execute the necessary documents in a form approved by the City Attorney. The motion carried unanimously.

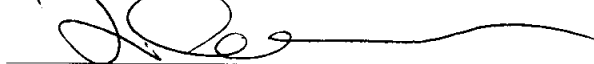
