

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL
HELD TUESDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2015, 7:30 P.M.**

CONVENE: Mayor Adams convened the Regular Meeting of the Monrovia City Council of Tuesday, October 20, 2015, at 7:30 p.m. in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, preceded by a Special Meeting / Salute to Service, at which all Councilmembers were present, with the exception of Councilmember Becky A. Shevlin, who was excused. In attendance were City Manager Oliver Chi, City Attorney Craig A. Steele, and City Clerk Alice D. Atkins.

INVOCATION: Joannie Yuille led the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Councilmember Gloria Crudginton led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL: In attendance were Councilmembers Alexander C. Blackburn, Gloria Crudginton, Mayor Pro Tem Larry J. Spicer, and Mayor Tom Adams. Excused: Councilmember Becky A. Shevlin

PRESENTATIONS/PROCLAMATIONS:

PR-1 Proclaiming the Month of November 2015 as Pulmonary Hypertension Awareness Month: The Mayor and City Council presented a proclamation to Joannie Yuille.

STUDENT GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVE REPORT: Student Liaison Bailey Underhill reviewed past and current events at the high school.

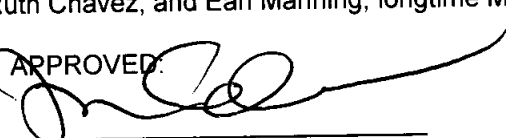
