

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL
HELD TUESDAY, JULY 17, 2018, 7:30 P.M.**

STUDY SESSION: Mayor Tom Adams convened the Study Session of the Monrovia City Council of Tuesday, July 17, 2018, at 5:18 p.m. in City Council Chambers, 415 S.
