

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE  
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL  
HELD TUESDAY, JULY 21 2015, 7:30 P.M.**

**STUDY SESSION:** Mayor Tom Adams convened the Study Session Meeting of the Monrovia City Council at 4:30 p.m. on Tuesday, July 21, 2015, in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all Councilmembers were present to discuss the Monrovia Renewal Capital Improvement Initiative and Analysis of Neighborhood Compatibility/Historic Preservation Options. The City Council directed Staff to bring back a resolution to the October 2, 2015, meeting calling for a Proposition 218 Public Hearing and protest vote related to water and sewer fee adjustments, bring forward engineering and design contracts with Civiltec and Merrell Johnson for the first phase of the Monrovia Renewal initiative, and bring back to the next meeting a policy statement and confirmation of direction for the Monrovia Neighborhood Study. Mayor Adams adjourned the meeting at 6:53 p.m.

**CONVENE:** Mayor Adams convened the Regular Meeting of the Monrovia City Council of Tuesday, July 21, 2015, at 7:30 p.m. in City Council Chambers. In attendance were City Manager Oliver Chi, City Attorney Craig A. Steele, and City Clerk Alice D. Atkins. Mayor Adams expressed his continued commitment to creating an inclusive environment and encourage more communication between other members of the City Council and the community, and explained that Mayor Pro Tem Spicer would chair the meeting.

**It was moved by Mayor Adams, seconded by Councilmember Shevlin, to adopt Urgency Ordinance No. 2015-06U; and to introduce, waive further reading, and read by title only Ordinance No. 2015-06.** The motion carried unanimously. It was noted that enforcement would be delayed for a 30-day period per City Council direction.

City Attorney Steele read the title of Ordinance No. 2015-06U as follows:


