

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE  
MONROVIA CITY COUNCIL  
HELD TUESDAY, MAY 19, 2015, 7:30 P.M.**

**STUDY SESSION:** Mayor Tom Adams convened the Special Study Session Meeting of the Monrovia City Council at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 19, 2015, in City Manager Conference Room, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all Councilmembers were present with the exception of Mayor Pro Tem Spicer, who was excused, to discuss 2015-2016 City Council Assignments. Mayor Adams adjourned the meeting at 4:45 p.m.

**STUDY SESSION:** Mayor Adams convened the Special Study Session Meeting of the Monrovia City Council at 4:45 p.m. on Tuesday, May 19, 2015, in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all Councilmembers were present with the exception of Mayor Pro Tem Spicer, who was excused, to discuss the 2015-2017 Fiscal Years Budget. The City Council gave direction to Staff to move forward with budget allocations for savings from the Hillside Bond refinance; continue with plans for Capital Improvement Program and bring back details for Prop 218 process for funding, as well as plan for building reserves for future maintenance; look into potential revenue related to AirBnB-type vacation rentals, and provide additional reports related to cost recovery and prior budget-year comparisons. Mayor Adams adjourned the meeting at 6:46 p.m.

**CLOSED SESSION:** Mayor Adams convened the Closed Session Meeting of the Monrovia City Council and the Successor Agency to the Monrovia Redevelopment Agency at 6:45 p.m. on Tuesday, May 19, 2015, in City Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia, California, at which all Councilmembers/Boardmembers were present with the exception of Mayor Pro Tem Spicer, who was excused, to discuss the following Closed Session items: CS-1 Conference with Legal Counsel, Initiation of Litigation Pursuant to Government Code §54956.9 (d)(4); One (1) Potential Case (City Council); CS-2 Conference with Real Property Negotiator pursuant to Government Code §54956.8; 1109 South Myrtle Avenue and 102, 116, 120-124, 132 and 140 West Huntington Drive; Successor Agency Negotiator: Executive Director, City Attorney; Negotiating Party: Mt. **INVOCATION:** Chaplain Terrence Brown led the invocation.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** Councilmember Blackburn led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**ROLL CALL:** In attendance were Councilmembers Alexander C. Blackburn, Gloria Crudginton, Becky A. Shevlin, Mayor Pro Tem Larry J. Spicer, and Mayor Tom Adams.

**PR-1 Proclaiming the Month of May as Historic Preservation Month:** The Mayor and City Council proclaimed the month of May as Historic Preservation in perpetuity.

**PR-2 Proclaiming the Month of May 2015 as Older Americans Month and Recognizing 2015 Older American of the Year Honorees Tom and Aynn Freeman:** The Mayor and City Council proclaimed the month of May 2015 as Older Americans Month and presented a certificate to this year's honorees, Tom and Aynn Freeman, with assistance from Rebecca Romero, Assistant Recreation Coordinator.

Tina Cherry, Director of Public Services, reviewed the Agenda Report.




